SCHOOL NEWS:

From the Principal

At the elementary level, academic and social-emotional learning go hand in hand. As a school, we are committed to growing mindful citizens and promoting positive relationships among students and staff. A recent topic of conversation on how we treat others was a Taproot Theatre production on bullying. The group performed and then debriefed with students so that the performance was not just entertainment but also relevant learning. Teachers were provided an in-depth lesson plan to continue and concepts from the performance. One key takeaway was the “3 Rs” - students were taught to *recognize* bullying, *refuse* bullying, and *report* bullying to a trusted adult. Additionally, bullying was defined for students. Bullying is **not** someone being unkind or mean to you once, but rather behavior repeated over time. After such lessons we often see a period of “over-reporting” of bullying incidents for a few weeks. This provides teachers and administrators with an additional opportunity to review what bullying is, and what bullying is not, as well as respond to the behavior being reported.

Learning how to treat others with respect and kindness is an ongoing process throughout the year and is approached in a variety of ways. The obvious way we teach children kindness and respect is through proactively teaching and modeling it on a daily basis. We have several curriculums that help us do this:

1. In kindergarten and first grade we use *Super Flex* (click [here](#)).
2. In second grade we use *Roots of Empathy* where students are taught empathy through mother and baby classroom visits (click [here](#)).
3. In third grade we use *Steps to Respect* taught by our school counselor, Hema Thomas. *Steps of Respect* is an award winning social-emotional curriculum (click [here](#)).
4. In fourth and fifth grade, teachers use classroom meetings to address pertinent issues. This year, classrooms have been provided with structured meeting protocols from the school counselor to promote bullying awareness and positive relationships.

Our goal is to work with parents to prepare students academically, and also to help guide students in their social and emotional learning so that they can develop into respectful and kind people.
