SCHOOL NEWS:

From the Principal

I don't have a staffing/budget update for you at this time; look for "meaty" information in the March 22nd *From the Principal*.

Today I want to write to you about the March 13th, 6:30 p.m. community meeting to discuss boundaries for the Magnolia School slated to open Fall 2018. The meeting will be held at Catherine Blaine School in Magnolia. The purpose of opening Magnolia School is to reduce overcrowding at Coe, Lawton, and Catherine Blaine. Currently Coe is about 125 students over-enrolled, and we literally have no space left to house students. Coe needs a remedy to reduce overcrowding.

As I understand the structure for the meeting, it will start with a presentation explaining each of the four boundary options. Large maps will be shown (and explained) so that those attending can gain clarity about proposed boundaries.

Attendees will then get an opportunity to provide input in a variety of ways, including speaking to district personnel. Lastly, attendees will get an opportunity to indicate which boundary option they prefer. It is the School Board who will ultimately make the decision about boundaries for the new Magnolia School, but the voice of attendees will provide valuable input. The School Board will make the boundary decision in October or November 2017.

If you have a strong opinion about boundaries, if you want to provide clarity about the need to relieve overcrowding, if you want to provide input about possible grandfathering, come to the March 13th community meeting. This is a meeting to gain understanding about the four boundary options and to provide input. Don't miss this opportunity.

PCP – Planning, Conferencing, Preparation

Once in that shopping cart window, use the + symbol to add the quantity of prints or digital image items you would like. Digital files will be emailed to the email you register with.

5) Click on "View Cart". Click on "Check out". Fill out your billing and shipping info. If photos are purchased before midnight on February 15th, you receive free shipping. Click on "apply a coupon" next to the star symbol and enter FREESHIP. Any photos purchased after February 15th will include a \$7.25 shipping charge.

Monday, March 13, 2017, 6:30 to 8 p.m. at Catharine Blaine K-8, 2550 34th Avenue West

Magnolia Elementary School (2418 28th Avenue West) is scheduled to open as an attendance area elementary school in Fall 2018 to help relieve capacity challenges and accommodate future growth in Queen Anne and Magnolia. An attendance area will have to be established for Magnolia Elementary School to assign students. This means that the existing boundaries for Coe, Catherine Blaine, and Lawton will likely be changed.
